

SUBJECT: Hawaii State Association of Counties (HSAC) – 2023 Annual Conference Trip Report

From September 21-22, I attended the Hawaii State Association of Counties 2023 Annual Conference at the Kōloa Landing Resort at Po'ipū, Kōloa, Kaua'i. The HSAC Annual Conference bring together councilmembers from all of Hawaii's counties, other county, state, and federal government officials, and various stakeholders including representatives from Hawaii's business sectors, nonprofit organizations, and subject-matter experts.

The conference was a great opportunity to connect with other public servants and to learn from subject-matter experts on a variety of topics and issues that are pertinent and important to the City and County of Honolulu. Below is a summary of the meetings I attended during the conference.

**Buffet Lunch: Legislative Forum**

A panel presentation by leadership from the Hawaii State Legislature provided insight on how the counties can better engage at the Legislature. The panel also provided an overview of past and upcoming conversations happening at the Legislature. Through the discussion we were able to better assess the counties position in light of the State's legislative authority and priorities.

**Panel 1: Real Property Tax Reform**

A panel composed of the property assessment administrators from all counties led discussion on contemplated real property tax reforms. Councilmembers from Honolulu and other counties provided feedback on past and pending legislation, including their thoughts on how to move reform forward. The conversation was robust and provided an opportunity for meaningful dialogue about policies the City & County of Honolulu can replicate and policies that may be less appropriate for a jurisdiction of our size. The conversation is extremely relevant to our proposed property tax permitted interaction group and our discussions about how to provide relief for both homeowners and renters.
