I hope this message finds you in good health and spirits. As we welcome the month of February, I wanted to provide you with some important updates and highlights from our community. I am pleased to share that progress is being made on various infrastructure projects

in our district. From road repairs to park enhancements, we are working diligently to improve the overall quality of life for our residents. The McCoy Pavilion at Ala Moana Regional Park is ongoing and still set to be completed late Spring. The City is in the "Plan and Design" phase for a number of projects including erosion improvements along the stream in Manoa; Makiki District Park Master Plan improvements; Palolo Valley District Park gym improvements; street and roadway improvements on Pensacola Street, University Ave, and Kuahea Street; and bridge improvements at various locations around District 5. I would like to extend a big mahalo to our Department of Design and Construction who are working hard to get our CIP and infrastructure projects completed. As we head into our Budget season, please reach out to my office if there are any major projects you would like to see in your neighborhood that may be included in the Budget for FY24-25. Colunty

GRAB YOUR PICNIC BASKETS! - CITY INSTALLS NEW TABLES & BENCHES AT PARKS -

The Department of Parks and Recreation installed 299 new park tables and 347 benches islandwide! The city used a \$2.88 million federal grant to pay for the upgrades is focused on 61 parks in lower-income communities.



Old Stadium Park in Mō'ili'ili received the most installations: 28 Benches and 10 Tables. Mōʻiliʻili Neighborhood Park also has 12 new benches.

- Resolution 23-227 provides for the acquisition of land for public use of 1421 Pensacola Street. In the eminent domain proceedings, the Corporation Council is authorized and empowered to negotiate terms of settlement.
- Resolution 24-012 urges the City's first responder agencies to develop reasonable and effective access to dispatch radio communications. This is to allow for quick and accurate information to the public in emergency situations.
